On the first page, it should look like the image to the right. This is so the document can be read at any point without confusion: all the information required is on the first page.

The word count, page count and age range is set across the bottom line of the page. They are to be placed in the order of the words. However, it can simply be 70500 words (the total words of the full manuscript) on its own, only if they are in the order provided.

This is a first paragraph. This is simply the show the format of the work we wish from all authors when submitting either the initial ten pages or first chapter and the full manuscript (if requested).

The font used in this document is Goudy Old Style. At 12pt. Spaced at 2.0 in paragraph styling. There are no spaces after the paragraphs, but there is before. This is so it is comfortable to read all the submissions! There is also an indent of 0.25 (the first little line across the bar going across a word document).

Although the space and paragraph style spacing is a must, the font is entirely up to you as, long as it's readable within these conditions: New Times Roman, Book Antiqua and Baskerville Old Face are other fonts which are very comfortable in this styling, and are somewhat similar to one another, with subtle differences. The layout of the manuscripts – initial and requested – must be comfortable for the eyes of the reader in the publishing house. This means there are some restrictions. The details used on the document to the left states the settings used. There is no rules for where the chapter heading must start – but maybe set it on the first line, more words to share! And separate the body by one line from the chapter heading. There are also no rules for the headers or footers, either. It all must be

comfortable to read, on a screen and if printed out.
